We serve the society through an array of services - street cleaning, plantation, jalsatra camps during summer, clothes and food distribution to the needy, blanket distribution during winter and moral value teaching amongst children through Balvikas classes in 15 Centres.

We are to open one polyclinic very shorty and to dedicate one bed in B. S. N. Hospital for the service of the poor in the name of our Beloved Master.

We dedicate this report at the Lotus feet of our Lord Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba and express our deepest gratitude to Him for giving us the opportunity of serving mankind through this unique organization.

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Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations



The Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations, founded by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba in the year 1965, is a service organisation with a spiritual core and base to benefit all mankind irrespective of religion, caste, creed or sect. The Organisation serves as a platform for its members to undertake service and other activities motivated by an urge for one's own transformation with the aim of realising one's inherent divinity.

Without any distinction of religion, nationality, race, socioeconomic status, either for those who work in the Organisation or for those who are served by it, the Organisation transcends all barriers leading humanity towards the ideal of 'Fatherhood of God and Brotherhood of Man'.

The concept of fees or membership subscription is alien to the Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations, for there cannot be any fee or subscription for one's journey towards his own self.

The organisation functions through its primary units called as Samithis and Bhajan Mandalis of which individuals - from different strata of society, different ethnic groups pursuing different religions and faiths -are members bound by the dictum of "Love all, Serve All" and pursue their own sadhana towards selftransformation following the path of selfless service to humanity.

At no point is an individual asked to follow a certain religion or rituals. On the contrary each is inspired to follow his own faith so as to ensure that a Hindu becomes a better Hindu, a Muslim becomes a better Muslim, a Christian becomes a better Christian and so on. In fact, this spiritual basis inspires everyone to pursue his own religion better by putting into practice Love and Selflessness. That is why the Organisation features in its emblem the symbols of the major religions of the world.

The Organisations named after Me are not to be used for publicising My Name, or creating a new cult around My worship They must render seva (service) to the helpless, the sick, the distressed, the illiterate and the needy. Their seva (selfless service) should not be exhibitionistic; it must seek no reward, not even gratitude or thanks from the recipients. Seva is sadhana (spiritual exercise), not a pastime of the rich and well placed. You must have the firm belief that the aim of this Organisation is to remove the obstacles that keep man away from God, that separate maanavathwa (Humanity) from Maadhavathwa (Divinity).. This Organisation must elevate the human into the Divine."

WINGS OF THE ORGANISATION

Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations functions under three wings viz. (i) Spiritual, (ii) Education, and (iii) Service. Each activity in a wing is directed to facilitate and help the members in their own spiritual advancement. Although, the nature of activities undertaken under different wings appear to be distinct and dissimilar, but there is an inherent interrelationship amongst all the three wings. ADMINISTRATION OF THE ORGANISATION

Headed by an All India President who is supported by the National Vice Presidents and State Presidents, the Organisation functions like a welloiled machine, focused on its purpose, clear in its vision and dedicated in its efforts to live up to Swami's message "Love All, Serve All".

The Samithis and the Bhajan Mandalis constitute a genuine spiritual movement where the members are united by a common bond Love for God and Service to fellow human beings.

The members of the organisation work as one cohesive unit whether as sevadals providing service

at Prashanthi Nilayam, at medical camps, doing Narayan seva or the Bal-Vikas gurus who work with young children to imbibe in them a desire to follow the five human values of Truth, Righteousness, Love, Peace and Non-violence, or the teachers who having undergone the training in EHV help in guiding the young minds towards the higher goals of life or the Sai Youth who work tirelessly in the Sri Sathya Sai Village Integrated Programme bound by one goal of practicing the ancient dictum of "Service to Man is Service to God".

THE 9 POINT CODE OF CONDUCT AND 10 PRINCIPLES

Every member of the Organisation is expected to undertake Sadhana (spiritual discipline) as an integral part of his/her daily life by observing by the following Nine Point Code of Conduct which has been given by Sri Sathya Sai Baba for one's spiritual and personal development. In addition, the ten principles that form the core of guidance for all the members of the Organisation as ordained by Baba himself are also produced hereunder. The nine-point code of conduct and the ten principles are fundamental to the spiritual development of the members of Sai Organisations.

9 Point Code of Conduct

- Daily meditation and prayer.
- Devotional singing/prayer with members of one's family once a week.
- Participation in Bal Vikas programme by children of the family conducted by the Organisation.
- Attendance at least once a month at Bhajan or Nagar Sankeertan programme conducted by the Organisation.
- Participation in community service and other programmes of the Organisation.
- Regular study of Sai literature.
- Speak softly and lovingly with everyone with whom he comes into contact.
- Not to indulge in talking ill of others especially in their absence.
- Putting into practice the principle of "Ceiling on Desires" and utilise any savings thereby generated for the service of the mankind.

10 Guiding Principles

- Treat as sacred the land in which you were born. Have patriotism to your nation - but do not criticise other nations or put others down. Not even in your thoughts or dreams should you think of bringing grief to your country.
- Respect all religions equally.
- Recognise humanity as one family treat everyone as a family member - love all
- Keep your house and surroundings clean for this will promote hygiene and health.
- Practice charity but do not encourage beggars by giving money. Provide food, clothing, shelter and help them on other ways (do not encourage laziness)
- Never give a bribe or take bribe never give into corruption.
- Curb envy and jealously; expand your vision and outlook, Treat all equally regardless of caste or creed.
- Be self-reliant. You may be wealthy and have servants to do your bidding, but service to society must be done by yourself.
- Have and cultivate 'Love for God and fear of sin'.
- Never go against the laws of the land; follow these diligently both in word and in spirit. Be an exemplary citizen.

BRIEF HISTORY

In the year, 1974, Bankura district was blessed by our beloved lord Sri Sathya Sai Baba through the hand of His ardent devotee Dr. Sambhunath Mukherjee, who was an eminent ENT Surgeon & Prof. at the B.S.Medical College and Hospital.

He arranged Bhajans in his residence with a few devotees namely Sri. D.P. Bajoria, Sri. Moni Aichbhowmik, Sri. Liladhar Suhasaria, Sri. Biswanath Bajoria, Sri. Kalo Baran Shit, Sri Goutam Mondal, Sri. Ajit Roy and Sri. Ajit Kundu.

Dr. S.N.Mukherjee selected Sri. K. B. Shit as Convenor and Sri. D. P. Bajoria as President of the District Organisation. Subsequently, in addition to bhajans, a Charitable Allopathic Clinic was opened at Dharamsala, Bankura in the year 1978 with two retired doctors rendering their valuable service every Thursday; This charitable clinic is still running every Saturday evening. From then on, the organization became associated with different service activities. In that very year (1978) Bankura, Burdwan and Midnapur districts were affected badly by a devastating flood. Immediately the members of Bankura District Sai Organisation plunged into action and assisted relief work by sending Sevadal to the flood affected areas. They sent clothes, food and medicine for the people in the flood affected areas. Its effort was highly appreciated by the district administration.

In the year 1985, Balvikas Classes were initiated at the residence of Sri. K. B. Shit, with a handful of students. Gradually, more people got interested in the service activities conducted by the organisation and this, coupled with their interest generated through the bhajan sessions, prompted them to join the organization. And thus, in the year 1986 – with the blessings of our beloved Lord a new samithi was formed in Bishnupur. Sri. Bhagawabandas Swarada, Sri. Radheshyam Susreka, Sri. Gunadhar Biswas, Sri. Gobardhan Kar and Sri. Hukumchand Ghosh were among the first to personally seek the blessings of Swami at Puttaparthy to do so. Subsequently Sri. Prasanta Panja was blessed by Swami to be the Zonal–In-Charge of three districts namely Bankura, Burdwan and Purulia.

The Bhajans and Balvikas Classes were going on in full swing regularly at two places i.e. Bankura and Bishnupur.

In the year 1989, at the behest of Bhagawan Baba and to bridge the vacuum created due to transfer of Dr. S. N. Mukherjee, ENT Specialist to Kolkata, another eminent Doctor, Dr. Jitendra Nath Banerjee, along with his wife, Smt. Dipanwita Banerjee joined the Bankura Sai Organisation and in the year 1992, Dr. Banerjee was made in-charge of Bankura Sai Organisation and later, in the year 2000, he was made the District President of Bankura Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation considering his exemplary performances in all respects. Later, as per instruction of State President, Dr. Banerjee as District President, paid attention to the expansion of Sai Organisation of Bankura and thus with the blessing of Baba, another Sai Samithi was formed at

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Mayakanan in the district of Bankura. Mayakanan Sathya Sai Seva Samithi started in the year 2001 with a good number of devotees under the Convenorship of Sri Manik Chandra Bir (whose father was also a Former Devotee). Miracles of Swami and the nature of the seva done at His abode inspired them to engage in different seva activities such as free medical camps, narayan seva, free coaching and computers, urinal cleanings, hospital cleanings, Bal Vikas classes and yearly Football Tournament on the occasion of Swami's Birth Day. Thus, Swami's name and His messages started spreading in the nearby villages of Mayakanan such as Pingrui, Pachami and Kalaberia. Bhajan Mandalis started coming up there with the blessings of Bhagawan Baba. A peculiar lila of Baba took place in village of Nutangram where without our knowledge a few innocent and pious people continued swami's Bhajan and Seva activities for a considerable long time with the direct supervision of one of our long-time devotees namely Sri. P.S. Sukul of Durgapur under district of Burdwan and later he informed of this to the Bankura District Organisation for inclusion and in the year 2006 it is declared as a Bhajan Mandali and being pleased with this, devotees of this area started involving themselves with more and more seva activities, bhajans, nagarsangkirtan, Balvikas classes and they also started going to Puttaparthi for Prashanthi Seva, as many as three times in a year. In this very year of 2006, Swami's divine acts spread awe amongst devotees across the length and breadth of Bankura district. with the growing activities in Gopalpur Village, Swami blessed the district with another Bhajan Mandali in nearby village Onda & Chandrakona with a good number of Devotees in the year 2008 & 2009 respectively. They also constructed permanent Seva Service Centres for running Balvikas classes, Charitable Dispensary,

bhajans, free coaching classes and dance classes and their activities drew special attention of the ONDA Police Station, and the said people were also spellbound with on-going service activities. Gradually in the same year i.e. 2009 Deogharia Sathya Sai Seva Samithi was formed at village Deogharia under Indpur Police Station where all kind of Seva Activities were performed in a routine manner, with a large number of dedicated youths. As a result of benevolent activities on the part of Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation of Bankura District Organisation and marvellous creation of two Sai Healing Temples (Sathya Sai Super Speciality Hospital) at Puttaparthi and Whitefield for the noble cause of mankind left an indelible impression on the people of Bankura. This paved the way for opening of some more Samithis and Bhajan Mandalis in villages namely Jiorda, Jambedia, Dangarampur, Unra, Jhantipahari etc. In course of time, two more villages, Shyamdaspur & Chariya were adopted and different activities such as narayan seva, free coaching camp, dance classes and Bal Vikas classes are being conducted there with close and direct supervision of District Team. These two villages are now under SSSVIP Village and as such special attention & care is paid by providing special activities such vocational training, health awareness camps, veterinary camps, distribution of agricultural apparatus & seeds & saplings, plantation of trees & saplings, study materials, drama & dancing classes. To bring to fruition the long-cherished desire of our State President to spread Sai messages & service activities of Sathya Sai Seva Organisation to the farthest corners of the district, Bankura District Team worked relentlessly to open new Sai Centres, resulting in one at old & historical place of Sonamukhi village and another one at remote village namely Keliapathar under Khatra Sub-Division

OVERVIEW

Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations is functional in Bankura with members from various cross sections of society and different faiths. With around 5(Five) Samithis and 4(Four) Bhajan Mandalis, the Organisation serves as a platform for its members to undertake spiritual practices through its various wings such as spiritual, education and service for their own betterment.

The thrust is on self-transformation for it is only individual transformation that would ultimately lead to global transformation.

ACTIVITIES

The members of the Organisation are involved in various activities on regular basis which primarily includes Spiritual Study Circles, Community Bhajan, Nagarsankirtan through the spiritual wing; Bal-Vikas and Parenting programmes through the Education Wing and various service activities through the service wing. Importance is given to regular service activities as only through constant involvement in good work can self-transformation be achieved. Service activities which are regularly undertaken at Samithis for the transformation of the members and for the benefit of the society include visits to leprosy, correctional and old age homes, medical camps in villages, Narayan-seva, free coaching classes, vocational training for employability enhancement of the villagers, sanitation at public functions, fairs, and public urinal cleaning.

Medical Camps are were conducted at Bankura Sai Seva Kendra and Keliapathar Village. The beneficiaries range from 50 - 55 at each occasion and around six sevadals are involved.
