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Bhagawan's Divine Message Selfless love and firm faith


A heart without love is lifeless;
Can you call that life
Merely because there is
Breath in the body?
It is just a pair of bellows.

EMBODIMENTS of Love! The hall-mark of love is *thyaaga* (selfless sacrifice). Love seeks nothing from anyone. It bears no ill-will towards anyone. It is utterly selfless and pure. Failing to understand the true nature of love, man yearns for it in various ways. Love has to be cherished with feelings of selflessness and sacrifice. In what is deemed as love in the world--whether it be maternal love, brotherly love, or friendship---there is an element of selfishness. Only God's love is totally free from the taint of selfishness. Divine love reaches out even to the remotest being. It brings together those who are separate. It raises man from animality to divinity. It transforms gradually all forms of worldly love to Divine love. To experience this Divine love, men must be prepared to give up selfishness and self-interest. They must develop purity and steadfastness. With firm faith in the Divine, they must foster the love of God regardless of all obstacles and ordeals.

However, even the feeling of universal brotherliness is not the same as the experience of *Ekathvam* (oneness). Even in such a fraternal feeling there is an element of self-interest. Those who really wish to promote universal brotherhood should develop the consciousness of the one Spirit dwelling in all beings. Even brothers are often found engaged in mutual bickerings and hatred. What is described as fraternity may not be real and unsullied love. True love should express itself in the awareness of the presence of the Divine in one and all. Names and forms may differ but the indwelling Spirit is the same in all.

One filled with Divine Love will be fearless.

Fill your hearts with love. One will be betraying himself if he entertains evil thoughts, but pretends outwardly to be full of love. No one having Divine love will ever fail to manifest it anywhere at any time. Students, who behave well during their stay in the Institute, should



maintain the same behaviour wherever they may live or work after leaving the Institute. There should be no room for any outside association or circumstances to change their conduct. Love should be firmly implanted in their hearts. One filled with Divine Love will be fearless, will seek nothing from others, and will be spontaneous and selfless in expressing his love. There is no need to pray for gifts from God. God will give of His own accord what is good for any devotee. Did not Shabari and Jataayu get the grace of Raama even without their asking for it? God will decide what to give, when to give, and where. Hence, all actions should be dedicated to God and He should decide what the devotee is fit to receive. When everything is left to God out of pure love and total faith, God will take care of the devotee. People today lack such firm faith. In the path of devotion many ordeals have to be overcome. Great devotees in the past faced such ordeals with faith and fortitude. Ultimately they secured the grace of the Divine and experienced bliss.



Dhruva's example

For example, take the case of Dhruva. He was a five-year old boy, who knew little about the affairs of the World. He acted upon the advice of Naaradha and through severe penance was able to have a direct vision of God. His faith enabled him to secure this experience. But, when Vishnu appeared before him and asked him what he wanted, Dhruva said: "Lord! You came to me, knowing where I was doing my penance. Is it conceivable that you could not know what I want?" The Lord said: "I know what for you performed the penance.. When you set out from your home you took a resolve that you will perform penance and secure a boon from the Lord that you should be enabled to sit on the lap of your father. I want to know whether your words and actions are in harmony." Dhruva said: "It is true that I came to perform penance for a small favour, a piece of valueless glass as it were. But, experience of your Form is like a diamond to me. What good fortune is mine that while seeking a glass bead I had found a brilliant diamond. I have no use for that glass piece." The Lord saw the contradiction between Dhruva's original resolution, his

penance and his present desire. The Lord told him that he should stick to his original wish for which he had performed the penance and therefore return to the kingdom with the Lord's Blessings. This emphasizes the need for unity in thought, word and deed.

Recognise the Divine in the entire cosmos

For achieving anything in life, two things are essential: firm faith and pure love. People should not think that pleasure and pain are caused by some external forces. It is not so. They are the result of one's own thoughts. There is no meaning in blaming others. If you develop love of God, that love will banish all sorrow and evil tendencies like attachment, anger and envy. Students should pursue both spiritual education and secular studies.

You have to realise that Nature is also a manifestation of God. Hence, Nature should not be ignored. Nature is the effect and God is the cause. Hence you should recognise the imminence of the Divine in the entire cosmos.

Also one wonders to see the free Seva is rendered by the volunteers from various states in India at Prasanthi Nilayam in all spheres of Service activities round the year.

Prasanthi Nilayam (Puttaparthi) being part of Andhra Pradesh, giving wonderful opportunities for each and every Sevadal of the State to render service at the divine abode on all important occasions. The SSSSO, AP has initiated its own website this year which gives all the relevant information of the activities of the Organisation and its members. SSSSO, AP has 317 Samithis, 1196 Bhajan Mandalis, 360 Sathya Sai Mandirs/Service Centres in the 14 districts of Andhra Pradesh. It is a great opportunity to like minded people to join seva at their respective places.

SSSSO, AP conducts innumerable number of Spiritual activities in all its centres, like Bhajans, Nagar Sankeerthans, Festivals to promote

Indian Culture and Spirituality. It has 7 Mobile Medical Vans with all diagnostic facilities, which go to villages to treat poor and needy patients. The patients are also taken to nearby towns for followup surgeries etc., and dropped back at their villages after treatment. In this year 69751 patients were treated. The Organisation is conducting free Nitya Anna Seva in 7 Govt/RIMS Hospitals for 5500 poor patient's attendants on daily basis.



SPIRITUAL ACTIVITIES

With the Blessings of Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba a number of Spiritual activities were undertaken in the state of Andhra Pradesh during 2018-19. A gist of the activities is presented below:

The activities of the year began with celebrations of Bhagavn Sri Sathya Sai Baba vaariAaradhanotsavam on April 24th. All the Samithis in the state celebrated Aaradhanautsavam by doing Narayana Seva on large scale, distribution of clothes etc to the needy, Veda Parayana, Abhishekams, Bhajan etc., on the occasion.

Esawramma Day

On May 6th Esawramma Day was celebrated all over the state in all samithis. Various programmes such as Balavikasstudents rallies, cultural programmes and bhajans were conducted. All the programmes on that day were conducted by Balavikas students.

Gurupoornima

Gurupoornima was celebrated on July 27th remembering Viswa guru Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba. All the samithis celebrated Gurupoornima by conducting special bhajans and by arranging talks on importance of Gurupoornima.

Varalakshmi Vratam

Mahilasevadal members celebrated Varalakshmi vratam on August 24th in all the samithis. In many places saamohikavaralakshmivratams were conducted by involving all the ladies of those areas. This developed a bond of love with all those and all the ladies felt happy.

FESTIVALS

Sri Krishna Janmashtami

September 3rd was celebrated as Sri Krishna Janmashtami throughout the state. "Utti" utsavam was celebrated on this day and special bhajans were conducted. In Sitaramapuram samithi of Vijayawada seven-day function was celebrated starting from Janmashtami by Sanaathana Bhagavata Bhakta Samajam to which Bhagavan Baba is the President. All these seven days various programmes were conducted and for five days kalyanams of different devatas were performed. On the last day Poornahuti was done. Devotees participated and enjoyed the spiritual atmosphere and sought Bhagavan's blessings.



Vinayaka Chaturdhi

VinayakaChaturdhi was celebrated on September 13th by all the samithis. Samithis celebrate this festival for three days to nine days during which period everyday poojaas and bhajans and cultural programmes were conducted. On the last day "Nimajjanam" is performed with traditional system. During Ganesh Navratri time Bhajan singers from various samthis are invited to perform bhajans at Ganesh pandals.



Dasara Navratri

Dasara Navaratri was celebrated for nine days starting from October 10 to October 19th. Dasara is celebrated as a symbol of victory over evil. All the samithis in state celebrated Dasara by installing idol of goddess Durga and performing poojas for nine days. Bhajans, cultural programmes and special talks on importance of Dasara Navaratri were arranged by many samitis.

Deepavali

Festival of lights, Deepavali was celebrated samithis throughout the state on November 7th. Sitaramapuram Smaiti, Vijayawada, celebrated Deepa Lakshmi Pooja on a grand scale and many mahilas participated. Some samitis celebrated Kartika deepotsavam in the month of Kartik starting from Deepavali

Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba Vari Janmadinotsavam

Bhagavna Baba's 93rd Birthday was celebrated by all samitis and Bhjana Mandalis and performed many activities during the entire month. Many samitis conducted 93 hours bhajans, 93 songs bhajan sessions. Naryanaseva was conducted on grand scale by almost all samithis. Special Bhajans, rallies and Swami vari "ooregimpu"(procession of Swami's photo) marked the Birth day celebrations of Swami.

Mukkoti Ekadasi

Mukkoti Ekadasi was celebrated on December 18. On this day samitis arranged "Uttara DwaraDarsanam" of Swami and special Bhajans and talks were arranged.

Christmas

On December 25th Christmas was celebrated by samithis to mark the Birthday of Jesus Christ. Special Nagara Samkeertana with candles and Bhjans, and talks by a church father were arranged by many samithis in the state.

Samkranthi

Makrasamkranthi festival indicating shifting of the Sun to Makara raasi was celebrated for three days starting from 14th January.

Maha Shivaratri

Maha Shivaratri is an important festival and was celebrated by all samithis. Devotees from all over the state visit nearby temples for darshan after taking holy dip in nearby river. Sevadal from various samithis rendered seva both at river ghats and temples such as Simhachalam, Kankadurga temple, Vijayawada, Kotappakonda, Guntur district and many other places in the state. Also medical camps are arranged at these place to render medical services to the devotees visiting temple.



OTHER SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

Study Circles & Sadhana camps

Study Circles help devotees to study and understand various spiritual aspects of life as kindly explained by Swami. Participation in Study Circles help every participant to enrich his/her spiritual knowledge and tread the path suggested by Swami. Many samithis in the state conduct study circles regularly. Sadhana camps are also very important means to develop mutual love, updating organisational knowledge and also enrich spiritual knowledge. Many samithis in the state conduct sadhana camps once in three months. Devotees participate with enthusiasm and enjoy the blessings of Swami.



Avatara Prkatana Dinotsavam

October 20th was celebrated as Avatara declaration Day to mark the day on which Swami announced His Avatar and His Mission. All the samithis celebrated by performing abhishekams, processions, bhajans, Narayana Seva etc.

Akhanda Bhajan

Starting at 6pm on second Saturday in the month of November to 6pm on next day i.e. Sunday continuous Naama Sankeertana was conducted by all the samithis in the state.

Bheemaradha Santhi & Bhagavath Geeta Sapthaham

Elderly couple who completed 70 years of age are respected by celebrating the occasion as "Bheemaradha Santhi" mahotsavam. During the year Gonthinavanipalem Bhajana Mandali, Gajuwaka samithi, Visakhapatnam, celebrated Bheemaradha Santhi for 9 couple. Bhagavathgeeta saptaham was celebrated by Gajuwaka samithi in December 2018.

Samarpan programmes

Some samithis such as Visakhapatnam, Srikakulam, Rajam etc., conducted samarpan programmes inviting alumni of Swami's institutions and also devotees who had close association with Swami to share their experiences. These programmes help devotees to reinforce their devotion to Swami.

Vedam training classes

Vedam training classes were also conducted by many samithis to impart knowledge in vedam and also to regularly chant vedam in samithis. Many samithis regularly chant vedam before bhajan session and these vedam classes are aimed to spread the importance of vedamchanting to many.

In Krishna district a special exhibition by name “ Goodadevi Vaibhavam” is held every year in the month of January in different places. 


Brief Report of Balvikas activities 2018-2019

April 24th, 2018 – Swami’s Vari Aaradhana Mahostavam

During the Swami’s Aaradhana Mahostavam, Balvikas students and Gurus of various districts participated in various service activities as well as spiritual activities like Buttermilk distribution, food packets distribution, Maha Narayana Seva, Tandularchan etc.,



May 1st to 6th 2018 Eswaramba Vaarostavamulu

All the districts of Andhra Pradesh State Organised summer camps for Balvikas Students. In the name of Matrusri Eswaramma vaarostavamulu. In these summer camps, different activities and topics were covered for students by Gurus. On May 6th on the occasion of Eswaramma Vardhanthi, a rally was organised and service activities were taken up by the students. Students offered MATRU POOJA to their Mothers’ in the memory of Eswaramma garu. The programme ended with Cultural programmes.



- In East Godavari Summer classes on Indian Culture were conducted in Amalapuram, Kakinada, Rajahmundry zones. Competitions were conducted to develop skills in the children.
- A 93 hours bhajan Programme was conducted at Vizianagaram District from 23-05-2018 5-00 P.M to 27-05-2018, 2-00 P.M. Around 700 BV students and 80 Gurus participated in this programme.

SRI SATHYA SAI VIDYA JYOTHI (SSSVJ) Inspiring children by Empowering Schools

Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Jyothi programme, launched in 2016, has gained full momentum across the country with the active participation of thousands of samithis in the task ahead. The aim of this programme is to select existing, semi-operational, makeshift, dilapidated schools and turn them into fully operational, well-structured, collaborative schools, ultimately emerging into good healthy learning centres. SSSVJ does not interfere with the school curriculum; its focus is on improvement of the academic learning environment at the school, home and the village.

In the first phase called the 'Energise' phase, the attempt is to create interest, enthusiasm and fervor for this type of activity in students, teachers, school staff, parents and community.

'Empower' phase establishes the commitment of Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations to the school by providing teaching aids, library, books and enhancing the skills of the teachers. This stage brings out the willingness, enthusiasm, participation and capability of the schools.

The process of 'Equip' phase is on cost-intensive civil works like repairs to the dilapidated infrastructure, building of additional class rooms, repairs to damaged floors or leaky roofs, construction of compound walls, white washing of walls etc. Thus the physical condition and appearance of the schools get transformed.

In the 'Evolve' phase, the school is connected with the larger community by engaging the students in community competitions, linking schools and by impacting Government policy to meet deficiencies, if any.

In Andhra Pradesh, 56 schools have been identified and work is going on in several rural and semi-urban schools.

Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini program in Andhra Pradesh

Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini is an open-ended project to harness technology as the key enabler to replicate on a national scale, the success of the model of Integral Education, followed at the University and Schools founded by Bhagawan, where Value education is integrated into academics. The program was launched by Bhagawan on His 85th birthday, 23 November 2010, and has been implemented in schools bearing name of Sri Sathya Sai in India as approved by Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust. The pilot project has started with content creation integrating values in to the curriculum with seven jewel pedagogy in lesson plans; training teachers in lesson plan transaction using five teaching techniques; supporting teachers with teaching aids in activity based learning skills.

In AP the program has been implemented in 7 schools.

The facility will give 400 students to partake their lunch at one place. During the visit, Sri Ratnakar garu and visiting team of State President Sri Chalam garu addressed the gathering of parents and teachers of the school.

Deloitte Impact day 2018 had 9000 employees of Deloitte, contributing to Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini program by supporting 18 different teaching aids that are useful to teachers across 63 schools in India. They have effectively contributed to about 50,000 man hours as a corporate social responsibility initiative. This is the 6th successive year of Deloitte participation with the program.

A teacher training workshop was organized at Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vihar, Visakhapatnam on 29th May 2018 to empower teachers of Sri Sathya Sai Schools on content development and curation. A total of 45 teachers participated from 12 schools. SRI SATHYA SAI MEDICAL HEALTH SERVICES, ANDHRA PRADESH



“Doctors are like the fragrant flowers and Bhagawan is the invisible thread which binds them together in to a beautiful garland” – BABA

Keeping in mind the above Divine Directions, Sri Sathya Seva Organisations have rendered their medical services in various branches including veterinary services.

Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Health Services in AP has taken up healthcare to the rural doorsteps by

- Conducting medical camps with its team of doctors and paramedical staff with multi specialties which includes cardiology, Neurology, orthopedic, Gynecology, Dermatology, ENT, Ophthalmology, Dental etc., every month.
- Creating basic awareness on Maintaining good health and the preventive measures to be taken to protect oneself from diseases by demonstrations and video shows on basic health and hygiene covering food habits, personal hygiene and cleanliness of self and surroundings. They are also educated on the ill effects of bad habits such as drinking, smoking and chewing tobacco.

During the camps diagnostic services were provided and also identified critical and chronic cases brought to the nearest city/ town for further investigations, procedures and surgeries. The patients were taken care till they are recovered fully and sent them back to their respective Villages. With the Divine Blessings of Bhagawan Sri Sri Sri Sathya Sai Baba varu, Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Health Services project has completed EIGHT years of service to the poor and needy people.

Water in rural Andhra Pradesh and Telangana is very high in fluoride (2 to 4 ppm against the permissible level of 1.5 ppm) which causes Fluorosis, a crippling and painful disease affecting teeth and bones. Villagers are taught a simple method of reducing fluoride content using Alum to make their drinking water safe.

Educating the rural people on the importance of Spirituality in holistic health:

The medical community is increasingly becoming aware of the link between spirituality and healing. Villagers are taught to spiritualize their lives which will not only keep them away from vices but will also bring harmony to their homes and community.



**Service to humanity with Love and Care:
Achievements from 2011-18
(upto 31.3.18)**

162098 patients coming from villages and slums of 13 districts in 2754 camps were treated with love and care. 5338 Doctors, of various specialties in each camp are blessed with Seva Prasadam.

8144 Lab Tests, 375 ECG's were done in the mobile vans and clinics to diagnose intricate ailments and to monitor chronic diseases;

Ophthalmic cases, 19387 were treated with cataract surgeries and spectacles. In addition to this General procedures/Surgeries/biopsies, FNACs were also done. Cardiac investigations, procedures and surgeries were carried out in hospitals by bringing patients from villages.

Women with Gynecological problems were treated;

6103 patients have undergone dental treatment viz. extractions, fillings, scaling, partial dentures, full set dentures and dental fluoride stains removals;

156 VETERINARY camps are also conducted and screened 28063 animals and treated for various diseases.

**PERFORMANCE OF MOBILE HEALTH SERVICES
and SINGLE DOCTOR CLINICS IN AP**

28406 patients coming from different villages were treated in 512 mobile medical camps with love and care. During the camp. 79 Clinics run by SINGLE Doctor (138 Nos) and treated 11958 Patients by giving medicines and minor procedures.

Dedicated work in force:

4942 Doctors (Cumulative), average 6-12 doctors per camp and 5457 Paramedical staff are blessed with Seva Prasadam during the year.

**Service with Love and Care
District wise achievements during 2018-19**

SRIKAKULAM

Sri Satyasai General Medical Camps:

- General medical camps were conducted in rural villages periodically.
- 23 General camps 2 Dental 3 Cardiac 1 orthopedic and 1 ENT camps were conducted during the year and the total beneficiaries are 4431. A panel of 63 doctors participated in these camps.
- In addition to the above 26 Eye camps were also conducted with the Assistance of Shankar Foundation Eye Hospital, Visakhapatnam and examined 4200 patients. 2960 cataract operations were done during the year with the help of 31 doctors who rendered their services.



SRI SATHYA SAI MOBILE HOSPITAL:

On 16th January 2013 with the Assistance of GMR Group Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Hospital consisting ECG, Analyzer, Centrifuge, Micro Scope, X-Ray and Gyenic Equipment started services in the district.

10 Camps were conducted in 24 Villages. Medical Tests and treatment extended to 1865 patients.

Saikrupa clinic: A clinic is established at Pedda Mandiram of Srikakulam. Weekly around 2650 patients benefitted by this clinic. 7 Doctors and 7 paramedical staff are being attended to the clinic. Free medicines are being distributed to the patients.

In coordination and support with GEMS hospital an Exclusive CARDIAC camp was conducted in which ~300 Patients were screened. 272 ECG, 27 2 D Echo was done.

21 patients were referred for ANGIO GRAM and 4 Patients were advised surgeries.



VIZIANGARAM

Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Health Services commences its services in Vizianagaram District on 28.12.16.

During 2018-19, TWENTY camps were conducted covering 23 villages, benefitting 4312 patients.

74 cataract surgeries were done. 13 general follow up cases have been attended. 1557 lab tests, 111 ECGs were done. Besides above 40 ENT cases and 25 gynec cases have been attended. 6 Doctors participated in the camps.

Conducted one veterinary camps in which 300 Cows were treated. De worming 195, Mineral mixture given to 45.





VISAKHAPATNAM

Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Health Services in Visakhapatnam District have started in March, 2012. During 2018-19, SEVENTEEN mobile camps were done covering 308 villages. 6877 patients were benefited. 50 patients were given spectacles, 67 Cataract surgeries and 271 General surgeries were done. During the year 618 patients were treated for Dental problems and 540 were treated for Gynecology related problems.

In clinical center's 294 camps were done which benefitted 21059 Patients. These patients were treated for chronic and critical cases. Identified critical cases were taken to the nearest hospitals and care was taken till the patient became normal.

Some of the Medical center is equipped with Multi lab tests, X-ray, Ultra-sound scan (every Thursday) and ECG. In addition to the regular doctors the following Specialists Doctors will also render their services in CITY SAMITHI Center. Every 2nd and 4th Sunday Neurologist, Every 2nd Sunday Cardiologist, and regular Thursday and Sunday General medicine, Orthopedic, Gynecology, Dermatologist, Pediatrician, Ophthalmologist and ENT Doctors will render their services.

However further specialist treatment will be given to the patients based on the identified disease.





HOMEOPATHY

In clinical center's 371 camps were done which benefitted 10029 Patients. These patients were treated for chronic and critical cases.

CITY SAMITHI also conducts VIBRONICS clinics once in a week by a Doctor. It was conducted 32 Times and the total No of patients took the treatment are 122.

MEDICAL SERVICES IN TRIBAL VILLAGES

Visakhapatnam and East Godavari Districts conducted special medical camps in Tribal villages of Anantagiri and Hukumpeta Paderu Mandal's in Visakhapatnam District. Patients identified with chronic and critical diseases were brought to VIZAG and treated in GAYTRI hospitals and other super specialty clinics and send them back to their respective villages after they become fully normal. During the period of treatment, they were taken care in all respects depending on their requirement.



EAST GODAVARI DISTRICT

Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Health Services in East Godavari commenced in September, 2012.

During 2018-19, 44 camps were conducted benefitting 7262 patients. 7 Cataract surgeries, 29 spectacles were distributed to the needy people.

7385 Lab tests and 38 ECGs were done during the year. 138 patients underwent general procedures / investigations/surgeries during the year.

In addition to the above 2 MEGA MEDICAL camps were conducted at DONKARAI agency area and examined 1978 patients. 2333 investigations were done and 18 cases were referred and treated further in the hospitals.

30 EYE camps were conducted which benefitted 2303 patients. 96 HOMEOPATHY camps conducted and medicines were distributed to 6240 patients.



WEST GODAVARI DISTRICT

West Godavari District have conducted 7 Mobile medical camps during 2017-18 and 805 patients benefitted. Besides above, 44 eye camps were conducted benefitting 4883 patients. 528 cataract surgeries done and 915 spectacles were given to the identified patients. 7 Dental camps benefitting 1403 patients Were examined and 169 Procedures which include Extraction removal and filling were done. Three blood donation and 30 Blood screening camps were conducted. Five general surgeries were done at Ch. Pothepalli Hospital. Dr. R. Durga Das in his OWN clinic. An exclusive room was allotted to the patients refereed in the camps.

61 Homeo camps in 5 clinics were conducted and 11345 patients. were given medicines.

KRISHNA DISTRICT

Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Health Services were started in Krishna District in April, 2012.

During 2018-19 18 mobile camps were conducted and 4151 patients were benefitted which includes Orthopedic, Gynecology General Medicine etc.,

117 Camps were conducted in fixed clinics on weekly/bi weekly etc., and treated 17,886 patients. Chronic and critical patients were treated in the hospitals at Vijayawada and other major hospitals.

12 EYE camps were conducted and screened 750 Patients. 166 cataract surgeries were done.





QGUNTUR DISTRICT

During the year 156 camps were conducted and treated 11902 patients.

GUNTUR district is handling DERMATOLOGY CASES There is heavy response to Skin diseases. OP on Wednesdays crosses 200. They also conducted 8 VETERINARY camps, screened and treated 1438 cattle.

NELLORE DISTRICT

Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Health Services, Nellore, the tenth one is blessed by Swamy on 22.3.2015 at Prasanthi Nilayam.. Every first Sunday of the month, the mobile activity is performing in the village regularly. During 2018-19, Eleven MOBILE MEDICAL camps were conducted benefitting 1600 people. In addition to this 1 exclusive orthopedic and 2 General Medical camps were conducted and treated, 217 and 247 patients respectively. 32 EYE CAMPS were conducted and 943 patients were screened. 663 Cataract Surgeries were done.

CHITTOOR DISTRICT

During 2018-19, EIGHT camps were conducted benefitting 1415 patients. 260 Lab tests 20 ECGs conducted.

ANANTHAPUR DISTRICT

24 General camps were conducted benefitting 1200 patients. 12 EYE Camps were conducted screened 186 Patients and 14 Cataract operations were done.

52 camps were conducted in clinics and treated 5097 patients. 52 VIBRONICS clinics were conducted and 1200 people availed the facility. 2 Single doctor clinics were running by 2 Doctors and 3723 people were investigated and Medicines were given to them.

By Bhagawans grace, Sai Mahila and Mahila Youth of Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations of Andhra Pradesh participate and play very crucial role in the service activities conducted by Samithis such as Narayana Seva, Medical Camps, Mother & Child care programmes, Visiting Orphanage homes/schools & distribution of needy items, Seva during Winter (Blankets distribution etc), Seva during Summer (Buttermilk/Chappal/Umbrella distribution, cloakrooms during entrance exams etc), SSDT, Walk For Values, 19th Mahila Day etc.

- Mother & Child Programme benefits poor mothers who lack health awareness and nutritious food. Mahila Vibhag members distributed Sai Protein food, and done Seemantham for more than 1000 pregnant ladies. Narayana Seva (Food distribution) is being done in Government hospitals on 9th of every month in 9 Districts for pregnant ladies. Around 1000 baby kits were distributed for new born.
- Self Employment Trainings such as Tailoring, Maggam/Jardosi work, Basic Computer Skills, Tally/MS Office, Toys/Bags/Jewellery Making, Juices/Pickles/Chutney Powders Preparations, Beauticians Course, Mehendi Work, Detergent Powders/Liquids/Balms making etc.
- This year around 1500 mahila youth were trained under self-employment scheme across the state, 100% are earning starting from Rs 3,000 to Rs50,000 per month
- Personality Development Trainings such as Time Management, Soft Skills, Gap Analysis & Skills Learning Support, Nutrition, Indian Culture & Ideal Behaviour etc.
- More than 14000 girls have been given awareness/trained in the different schools and colleges.
- Health & Hygiene sessions were conducted in 27 Schools/Colleges for girls, installed 9 Sanitary Napkin Vending/Smashing machines. Conducted 2 Traffic awareness camps and 3 DM Training camps and Blood donation camp.
- Special Table for differently abled children, 10 Desks to VJ School, Medical camp@Ladies Central Jail, Fridge & 10 beds to orphanage/oldage home, Water cooler to school, 21 utensil set to the needy, around 2500 Sarees & Blankets to the needy, Diabetic & Cancer detection screening for 350 mahilas, Educational aids for school children in 3 schools, Tuition fees payment for 9 needy children, Tool kits for Livelihood(Tailoring machines, wet grinders, Knitting tool kits) around 150.
- Mahila vibhag motivates mahilas from all wings of the organization to participate in Prashanthi Nilayam Seva and ensures each sevadal to have a blissful seva during Swamis Birthday, Swamis Aaradhnostavams and New year seva period. Conducted 2 SD training camps per District.
- Swami blesses AP Mahila Vibhag with special seva opportunity in PN during festivals, Swamis Birthday, Swamis Aaradhonosthavam, and Conference (State/National/International). Prepared Pickles for PN festivals around 2500 kgs and support to improve the facilities in mahila sevadal building.
- Spiritual seva is the seed and foundation of SSSSO. Mahila vibhag conducts various mass spiritual events like Varalaksmi Vratams, Tandularchana, Gayathri Chanting etc during Mahila day on 19th of every month in around 75 Samithis.
- Around 20 mahila youth are supporting in IT work and DM activities.

Sai Mahila Youth is an integral part of Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations of Andhra Pradesh. Sai youth participates and play very crucial role in conducting the following regular activities in most of the Samithis/Units.

Spiritual Wing Activities – Spiritual wing helps nurture the inner self of all members. Mahila youth takes active participation in Veda chanting, Devotional singing, Study circles, Nagara sankeerthana, Akhanda Bhajans, Sadhana camps.

Balvikas Wing Activities – Balvikas is the seed and foundation for all other wings of SSSSO. Through the judicious use of simple teaching techniques such as: Prayer, Group Singing, Meditation, Story Telling and Group Activities, the Balvikas Gurus encourage the children to become conscious about the latent potential within and orient their lives on the trajectory of human excellence. Mahila youth are rendering their efforts as Balvikas guru – in teaching, in storytelling, conducting/helping group activities/essay competitions, Vidya Jyothi schools visit, Vidya Vahini Programme etc.

Service Wing Activities – Mahila youth participates in the service activities conducted by Samithis such as Narayana Seva, Medical Camps, Mother & Child care programmes, Visiting orphanage homes/schools & distribution of needy items, Seva during Winter (Blankets distribution) etc, Sevaduring Summer (Buttermilk/Chappal/Umbrella distribution, cloakrooms during entrance exams) , SSDT, Walk For Values, 19th Mahila Day etc. Mahila youth also participates in Prashanti Nilayam seva.

Special Activities – The Sathya Sai Youth had taken innovative programmes to encourage women, between the ages of 18 and 40, to lead purposeful lives in service of their families, communities and countries by learning and practicing the spiritual principles revealed by the life, teachings and work of Sri Sathya Sai Baba. Primary importance is given to holistic character development through both personal transformation and livelihood.

- Self Employment Trainings such as Tailoring, Maggam/Jardosi work, Basic Computer Skills, Tally/MS Office, Toys/Bags/Jewellery Making, Juices/Pickles/Chutney Powders Preparations, Beauticians Course, Mehandi Work, Detergent Powders/Liquids/Balms making etc. This year around 1500 mahila youth were trained under self-employment schme across the state, 100% are earning more than Rs 3000 per month.
- Personality Development Trainings such as Time Management, Soft Skills, Gap Analysis & Skills Learning Support, Nutrition, Indian Culture & Ideal Behaviour etc.
- More than 14000 girls have been given awareness/trained in the different schools and colleges.
- Health & Hygiene sessions were conducted in 27 Schools/Colleges for girls, installed 9 Sanitary Napkin Vending/Smashing machines.

This programme was taken up by all District Organisations during the period 2nd October (Gandhi Jayanthi) to 20th October (Avatar Declaration day). A number of activities aimed at cleansing the premises, mind and spirit have been planned and communicated to various samithis. In many places, devotees and the public also have taken part after getting attracted by the selfless efforts involved in making the programme successful. Prominent personalities were also present on the occasion. Balvikas gurus, Balvikas students & their parents, Sathya Sai Schools, Youth, Disaster Management team and all office bearers have invariably attended this activity on holidays. Total No of Man hours : 168212.



DEENAJANODHARANA PATHAKAM (DJP)

One of the important activities of Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation is the adoption of orphan boys who have no parents or having a single parent and bringing them up in an ideal manner. Boys in the age group of 6 to 9 are selected from SSSVIP villages after proper enquiry/assessment and then inducted into the DJP scheme. They are accommodated in Sri Sathya Sai Mandirs or residences of willing devotees. The boys are constantly under the care of Seva Samithi members and apart from good education, they receive training in the practice of spiritual and moral values, good habits and character. This has been going on in 10 districts at 18 centres in Andhra Pradesh where 247 children are admitted and groomed.

VESAVI VENNELA (Residential Summer Camps)

Vesavi Vennela have been conducted at different centres in AP for a period of nearly 10 days. Students from the allotted districts are brought to these centres where students spend the entire period in learning a variety of subjects like Bhajan singing, Veda chanting, Yoga, Cultural items etc., in addition to imbibing the essentials of Bhagawan’s teachings, Balvikas, Indian Culture and Spirituality.

This year Vesavi Vennela was conducted in Nellore, Nellore District from 12.05.2019 to 21.05.2019.

Sri Sathya Sai Disaster Management

Grace of Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba, Activities of Disaster Management wing for Andhra Pradesh started from the State meeting held at Prasanthi Nilayam on 10th October 2018. Our thankful pranams at the lotus Feet of Swamy for guiding and guarding to implement the action plan discussed in the state meeting. We also thank all the office bearers and members of the SSSSO for their support and love towards execution of the action plan.

Brief about “Disaster Management”

Designing of Disaster Management Wing was started in reference to the Swamy’s words while doing relief activity to Gujarat earth quake in 2001. Swamy said “We are able to relief activity... It would be better if we do rescue activity also.” Sri Syamal Sur designed and started the training camps to develop the Disaster Management wing as Swamy’s desired.

We can never predict a disasters / accident. Natural calamities like Earth quakes, floods, cyclones.... Etc are not only the disasters... a simple incident may lead to loss of life if we ignore. Hence it is everybody’s responsibility to save our society, family and self. So we intend everyone to undergo this DM training module designed and exacting throughout the nation.

AIM : To create awareness on Disaster Management among all the members of SSSSO and as well general public and make everyone ready to face disaster situations with the skills of disaster management. We pray Bhagawan Baba to enable us to execute this mission successfully. During this period we are able to give awareness

to the office bearers and members of the organisation in the following districts i.e. Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, East Godavari, Krishna, Prakasam, Chittoor, Kadapa and Kurnool. Members attended were understood the importance of the DM training and everybody is suggested to organise many more camps to reach all the public.

Apart from the camps for SSSSO, we have organised (1) One Day training at P.E.T. Training College, Proddutur, Kadapa District, (2) 2 days training at Police Training College, Anantapuram for newly recruited DSPs (25 No.s), (3) One Day awareness camp for the students of Sri Prakash Degree College, Tuni, East Godavari. We are thankful to the district administration of SSSSO for their cooperation to execute DM trainings in various institutions.

Prior to this period the team DM, SSSSO is got an opportunity to train 750 RSIs at PTC, Anantapuram.

The existing team (27 members) in Andhra Pradesh is Srikakulam (1), Visakhapatnam (12), East Godavari (1), Krishna (5), Chittoor (3), Kadapa (2) and Anantapuram (2) is ready to render their services as trainers and as well sevadal. The team is equipped with ropes, life jackets, fire extinguishers, life ring buoys, cutters etc.

For the convenience to organise more training sessions, we have made the state as two zones (1) Trainers from Srikakulam, Visakhapatnam & East Godavari will train Srikakulam to West Godavari (2) Trainers from Krishna, Prakasam, Chittoor, Kadapa, Anantapur will train remain part of AP.



As per the guidelines of our State President, SSSSO the DM Trainers Team planning to have Certified First Aid training and Diploma Course in DM very soon.

To develop working teams in every district DM Team AP will be having 2 training camps (2 days) for selected members of SSSSO from all districts. (1) 25th & 26th January 2020 for Srikakulam to Krishna (2) 8th & 9th February 2020 for Guntur to Anantapuram.

Sri Sathya Sai Water Purification Plants (SSS Premamrutha Dhara Plants)

With the inspiration and guidance from Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba, the Technology group of Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations (SSSSO) have established over 100 Water Purification facilities in various rural areas. The health hazards on account of fluoride contamination of drinking water was recognised and some of the worst affected villages have been selected by the Organisation to provide safe and pure water to thousands of people. With the initiative of the Technology group, SSSSO has provided necessary infrastructure to house and install purification plants with the latest facilities, ensured nonstop supply of drinking water and periodic checks for the smooth functioning of the systems. Water is provided at a nominal cost of Rs.2 per 20 litres against ATW smart cards. The funds are used to cover not only the operational and maintenance costs of the plant, but certain other welfare activities of the village as well. A local committee manages the functioning of the Plant in all respects. Details of production usage plant-performance are electronically recorded. Visible and appreciable changes have been observed in the health condition of the rural folk in all areas where such systems have been in operation.

SRI SATHYA SAI VILLAGE INTEGRATED PROGRAMME (SSSVIP)

The jewel in the crown of all these is the Sri Sathya Sai Village integrated programme (SSSVIP). This is a rare opportunity of serving the rural poor through a systematic and integrated approach in the areas of medicare, sociocare, educare, agricare, individual care, employment care and spiritual care.

Bhagawan's message on SSSVIP "On the holy occasion of Sarvajit Ugadi 2007, we are launching a new scheme for rural development, under the name, "Village works". Every house in every village shall be kept clean. The houses are to be kept neat and clean both inside and outside. The children in these homes are also to be groomed into clean and healthy children. We propose to cover every village under this scheme. Hence, we must undertake this rural development project immediately. The elders as well as children, the poor and rich, should all work united for the success of this project. It is seva (selfless service) that unites people. Both the villages and towns should join and work together in a spirit of unity....

Since 2013, the Seven-care concept of SSSVIP was launched in 56 needy villages of the Andhra Pradesh including the 25 Girijan hamlets of East Godavari where Sri Sathya Sai Drinking water project is in place. The following cares have been initiated for overall development:

1. EDUCARE
2. MEDICARE
3. SPIRITUAL CARE
4. EMPLOYMENT CARE
5. AGRICARE
6. SOCIO CARE
7. INDIVIDUAL CARE

These aspects are latent in the manifold activities taken up by the Organisation in the rural areas.

Educare : Classes by Bala Vikas Gurus are undertaken to provide comprehensive education in human values to the rural children. Distribution of notebooks, school bags, footwear etc. are done in almost all districts. In Krishna and Chittoor districts, separate programmes were conducted with emphasis on health and hygiene.

Medicare : In 8 districts of Andhra Pradesh, the Mobile Medical vans equipped with state of the art medical devices are rendering sustained health services by visiting SSSVIP and other villages and conducting camps there. Hundreds of sick people are benefited during each visit of the Medical Van in every district. SSSSO also takes care of follow-up cases in designated hospitals thus providing the much needed helping hand to the needy patients.

Spiritual Care : Activities like Bhajans, Nagarsankirthan, Pallaki processions, Spiritual talks, Tandularchana, celebration of festivals, conducting free marriages for the poor etc. form the core of spiritual activities. Small plays are enacted to drive home the ideas and teachings of Bhagawan Baba.

Agricare: Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation has been instrumental in taking the services of eminent Agriculture scientists for the benefit of farmers in SSSVIP villages. The farmers have been educated about the precautions to be taken before seeding as well the aer-care and remedial measures to be adopted in the case of attack by pests and insects. In some districts were also supplied high-yielding varieties of seeds.



Socio care: Establishing Water purification Plants, construction of sanitary toilets, providing solar lights, Tree Plantation and rainwater harvesting etc. are some of the activities taken up under socio care.

SSSSO offered training to unemployed youth through tuitions and short term courses to enable them to get gainful job placements. Similar Skill enhancement training programmes were taken up in a few districts for mahilas also in Computer basics, Tailoring, Dress-making, Fashion design etc. Individual Care : Help in the form of clothes, school needs for children, supply of Sai Protein food, 'Amrutha Kalasams' (a kit of provisions for a month's sustenance) etc. are extended to selected poor families. Model Villages also being developed in Andhra Pradesh where all the seven cares would be taken up.

The areas of activity were formulated with an aim of bringing about holistic transformation of individual lives and community living, by attacking the root cause of the persistent problems. This SSSVIP programme could aptly be termed the "Silent(Sai Lent) revolution" In each state, the service wing identifies the needy communities of the society and conducts activities accordingly.

Rendering selfless service or seva is best described in Swami's words "Seva eppudu kashtapadi cheya vaddu, ishtapadi cheyalu", meaning 'Never render service as an exertion, but do it with linking'. Seva should be done with a feeling of empathy and not superficial pity.

SAI REHABILITATION PROGRAMME – SRP

Sri Rehabilitation Programme we started in Andhra Pradesh during February 2008 and completed 10 years of service. It is unique initiative of Bhagawan's Super Speciality Hospitals in Puttaparthi and Bangalore, seeks to continue, sustain and boost the hospital-patient relationship.

Elsewhere, once the bills are paid and the patient is discharged, the hospital has hardly any connection with the patient. But those operated in Swamy's hospitals are never completely discharged, they are only handed over to another local doctor.

Post-surgery recuperative care and continuing doctor consultations for a period of six months and regular medication and diagnostic tests, and lifestyle changes, are vital for cardiac patients as most patients as most patients are poor and illiterates. Hence unlikely to understand this and to do this, Qualified Doctors in 14 districts are actively participating in the Divine activity voluntarily.



Sri Satya Sai Rural Vocational Training Centres (SSS RVTC)

What is RVTC:

Rural Vocational Training Centre is a by-product of the deep concern and selfless thought of Sri Sathya Sai Organisations, India aiming at improving the economic conditions of the unemployed youth in a particular village and to create areas of self-employment. Also it streamlines the youth by helping them to focus and hone their skills, rather than on unwarranted pursuits. Skill training is offered totally free of cost along with free boarding and lodging at selected few centres where the youth do not have access to the centre from their village. Skill trainings are catered according to the needs of the neighbourhood of that particular village by RVTC team.

Mission Objective:

- To train unemployed youth from Sri Sathya Sai Village Integrated Program(SSS VIP) villages and its neighbourhood in multi skills that are required in the rural areas.
- To help the trained youth to set up small service centers in their villages, enabling them to gain economic independence.
- To avert migration of village youth to towns and cities.
- To inculcate ethics and values in youth.

Why this focus on Youth:

Of the 1300 million Indian Population, 40% are in the age group of 13-35 years, defined as youth in the National Youth Policy(520 million) and, in this age group, the unemployment rate is 13% (67 million) and will grow to 15.5% (80 million) within a year. This rise in youth unemployment is not only because of the direct economic costs, but also due to the social impact of joblessness





manifested by increased crime, mental health problems, violence, drug taking and social exclusion are indicators of degenerating society. To establish a harmonious society for peaceful coexistence, which is Sri Sathya Sai Baba's Sankalpam, SSSSO has undertaken well known activities like Vidya Seva, Vaidya Seva, Water projects, Balvikas etc. Of all these, Balvikas, Swami's pet project, prepares the children who would certainly transform this society when they grow up (may be 15-20 years later). The SSSVIP programs, like Medicare (Vadya Seva), Narayana Seva (Annadhanam), protein distribution, housing etc serve the needs for the immediate present. The gap in between of these two i.e. of 15-25 years, when the current youth play a very important part in the competitive society, has to be filled with opportunities for these disadvantaged youth. The SSS RVC Program (Sri Sathya Sai Rural Vocational Training Center), started in the year 2014, exactly addresses this problem. Though some of these activities have been going on even prior to 2014, this has been systematized in 2014 and so far, 9400 youth were trained with 26 Centers serving across India.

Salient features of SSS RVC:

- The training is totally free of cost to the trainee
- Provides Seva opportunity to members of SSSSO.
- The duration of the training is 3 to 6 months
- The skills are selected according to the requirement/need of the village.
- In some centers, free boarding and lodging is provided for trainees. Districts, which do not have RVC, can send youth from villages to these centers for training.
- Free tool kits and uniforms are provided to trainees
- TVS MOTORS is very much involved with RVC.





Whenever requested, they provide training to the students in two wheeler repair and service at their service centers

- Integral to training curriculum is Sarva dharma principles, ethics, values and yoga.
- Project work: At the end of training, the trainees are sent to Prasanthi Nilayam to work in the Maintenance section. Normally it coincides with a particular State's Prasanthi Seva
- The RVTC mission was declared as a National initiative in April 2014. Following this directive, a number of Centers (26 as on date) were started across India and are functioning well. A brief summary of the performance of these centers is presented herein to understand the extent of the achievement of the well thought out objectives and sustainability perspective.

SSS RVTC in Andhra Pradesh:

Sri Sathya Sai Rural Vocational Training Centres (SSS RVTC) have been set up by SSSSO as one of the three National projects throughout the country. In Andhra Pradesh, they are established at Anantapur (Tadipatri) and West Godavari (Pothepalli).

SSS RVTC has so far trained about 100 youth in various skills like Domestic electrical wiring,

Plumbing, Pump set repair, AC repair, Tailoring and Maggam works, Tractor repair ,Mobile phone servicing etc.

The trainees have been provided with complete set of Tool kits so that they can earn their livelihood in their respective locations serving the surrounding villages.

New programmes to empower rural youth have been undertaken by providing free vocational training in those trades which are in great demand at village level. These trades are selected based on the information obtained from village survey, district employment office and job placement potential.

Youth wing of SSSSO have initiated several programs like RPL (Reprogramming Lives), Higher Education Projects and Youth conventions to empower the unemployed.

Women Empowerment:

In association with BIREED (Bankers' Institute of Rural and Entrepreneurship Development), several skill development programmes have been undertaken in Advance Tailoring, Maggam and Zardoshi , Beautician Courses etc. in most of the districts of Andhra Pradesh.





RIMS HOSPITAL SEVA




