PROTOCOL FOR ALLOCATION OF OXYGEN CONCENTRATORS

- 1. Concentrators will be allocated by the All India President to each state based on the requirement in a phased manner.
- 2. Each concentrator support to the beneficiary will be for a period of 48 to 72 hrs depending on the requirement and criticality. This device is being given to them to support their oxygen levels till they find a bed in a hospital. However, the final decision will be taken by the Local Doctor of the Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations evaluating the need to place the concentrator at a beneficiary for a longer time on a case to case basis.
- 3. The support primarily will be extended to the Covid Warriors Doctors and Nurses who are under Home quarantine and need support. The Category are the General Public beyond Caste Creed Region or Religion which has been the moto of our Organisations.
- 4. The State Organisations should ensure that a few youth members with a technical background are trained to set up these concentrators. These members should support only remotely (via video calls). Alternately, there are qualified technicians in each place who know how to operate these machines or read the vitals and such persons can be brought on board to support on a nominal charge of payment.
- 5. The disposables needed for the use of the Concentrator such as nasal canula and the nasal mask are also to be provided.
- 6. No financial dealing will be made for any components with the Concentrator.
- 7. One guarantor must sign stating that the machine will be returned by the stipulated date.
- 8. Necessary documentation such as Aadhar and PAN cards along with the consent form should be sent by Whatsapp/ Email before handing over the machine. An undertaking that the device or equipment shall be returned in the condition it is being handed over and not damaged should be taken. The format of such an undertaking will be circulated to all the State Presidents
- 9. No caution deposit or any amount should be collected.

- 10. To minimize contact and risk of exposure, the machine after sanitisation will be delivered at the doorstep and will be collected from the doorstep after usage.
- 11. All volunteers will handle these machines with latex gloves and proper personal protective equipment.
- 12. For every patient who takes the machine, a photo of Bhagawan Baba (Why Fear I am Here) and a Vibhuti packet should be given. A printout of relevant guidelines on home isolation and proning issued by Govt of India/ICMR can also be attached.
- 13. A three-member team (preferably consisting of 1 doctor) can be formed to triage and finalise the beneficiaries.
