Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations – an introduction



The Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations, founded by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba in the year 1965, is a service organisation with a spiritual core and base to benefit all mankind irrespective of religion, caste, creed or sect. The Organisation serves as a platform for its members to undertake service and other activities motivated by an urge for one's own transformation with the aim of realising one's inherent divinity.

Without any distinction of religion, nationality, race, socio-economic status, either for those who work in the Organisation or for those who are served by it, the Organisation transcends all barriers leading humanity towards the ideal of 'Fatherhood of God and Brotherhood of Man'.

The concept of fees or membership subscription is alien to the Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations, for there cannot be any fee or subscription for one's journey towards his own self.

The organisation functions through its primary units called as Samithis and Bhajan Mandalis of which individuals - from different strata of society, different ethnic groups pursuing different religions and faiths -are members bound by the dictum of "Love all, Serve All" and pursue their own sadhana towards self-transformation following the path of selfless service to humanity.

At no point is an individual asked to follow a certain religion or rituals. On the contrary each is inspired to follow his own faith so as to ensure that a Hindi becomes a better Hindu, a Muslim becomes a better Muslim, a Christian becomes a better Christian and so on. In fact, this spiritual basis inspires everyone to pursue his own religion better by putting into practice Love and Selflessness. That is why the Organisation features in its emblem the symbols of the major religions of the world.

"The Organisations named after Me are not to be used for publicising My Name, or creating a new cult around My worship....They must render seva (service) to the helpless, the sick, the distressed, the illiterate and the needy. Their seva (selfless service) should not be exhibitionistic; it must seek no reward, not even gratitude or thanks from the recipients. Seva is sadhana (spiritual exercise), not a pastime of the rich and well placed.

You must have the firm belief that the aim of this Organisation is to remove the obstacles that keep man away from God, that separate maanavathwa (Humanity) from Maadhavathwa (Divinity).. This Organisation must elevate the human into the Divine."

WINGS OF THE ORGANISATIONS

The Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation functions under three wings viz. (i) Spiritual, (ii) Education, and (iii) Service.

Each activity in a wing is directed to facilitate and help the member in his own spiritual advancement. Although, the nature of activities undertaken under different wings appear to be distinct and dissimilar, but there is an inherent interrelationship amongst all the three wings. The three wings stand for Worship, Wisdom and Work.

Spirituality and Service are supplementary and complementary to each other. Spirituality is the motivational force behind service and service is the fulfillment of spirituality. Therefore, spiritual concepts learnt through education must be put into practice in form of service to humanity. Thus, in order to successfully realize the objective of joining the Sai Organization, one must participate in activities of all the three wings.

ADMINISTRATION OF THE ORGANISATION

Headed by an All India President who is supported by the National Vice Presidents and State Presidents, the Organization functions like a well-oiled machine in the District under the stewardship of the District President, focused on its purpose, clear in its vision and dedicated in its efforts to live up the Swami's message – "Love All, Serve All".

The Samithis and the Bhajan Mandalis constitute a genuine spiritual movement where the members are united by a common bond – Love for God and Service to fellow human beings.

The members of the organisation work as one cohesive unit, whether as sevadals providing service at Prashanthi Nilayam, at medical camps, doing Narayan seva or the bal-vikas gurus who work with young children to inspire in them a desire to inculcate the five human values of Truth,

Righteousness, Love, Peace and Non-violence, or the teachers who having undergone the training in EHV help in guiding the young minds towards the higher goals of life or the Sai Youth who work tirelessly in the Sri Sathya Sai Village Integrated Programme and Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Jyoti Programme – each of them are bound by one goal – "Service to Man is Service to God".

THE 9 POINT CODE OF CONDUCT AND 10 PRINCIPLES

Every member of the Organisation is expected to undertake Sadhana (spiritual discipline) as an integral part of his/her daily life by abiding by the following Nine Point Code of Conduct which has been bestowed by Baba for one's spiritual and personal development. In addition, the ten principles that forms the core of guidance for all the members of the Organisation as ordained by Baba himself are also produced hereunder. The nine point code of conduct and the ten principles are fundamental to the spiritual development of the members of the Sai Organisations.

9 Point Code of Conduct

- ❖ Daily meditation and prayer.
- ❖ Devotional singing/prayer with members of one's family once a week.
- ❖ Participation in Bal Vikas programme by children of the family conducted by the Organisation.
- ❖ Attendance at least once a month at Bhajan or Nagar Sankeertan programme conducted by the Organisation.
- ❖ Participation in community service and other programmes of the Organisation.
- ❖ Regular study of Sai literature.
- ❖ Speak softly and lovingly with everyone with whom he comes into contact.
- ❖ Not to indulge in talking ill of others especially in their absence.
- ❖ Putting into practice the principle of "Ceiling on Desires" and utilise any savings thereby generated for the service of the mankind.

10 Guiding Principles

- Treat as sacred the land in which you were born. Have patriotism to your nation - but do not criticise other nations or put others down. Not even in your thoughts or dreams should you think of bringing grief to your country.
- Respect all religions equally.
- Recognise humanity as one family - treat everyone as a family member - love all
- Keep your house and surroundings clean - for this will promote hygiene and health.
- Practice charity - but do not encourage beggars by giving money. Provide food, clothing, shelter and help them on other ways (do not encourage laziness)
- Never give a bribe or take bribe - never give in to corruption.
- Curb envy and jealousy; expand your vision and outlook, Treat all equally regardless of caste or creed.
- Be self-reliant. You may be wealthy and have servants to do your bidding, but service to security must be done by yourself.
- Have and cultivate 'Love for God and fear of sin'.
- Never go against the laws of the land; follow these diligently both in word and in spirit. Be an exemplary citizen.

BRIEF HISTORY

The Sathya Sai Seva Samithi, Jaipur, is one of the oldest Samities of Rajasthan. Shri Prakasham Ji Initiated the organization work of samithi in 1970. But formally Jaipur Samithi was formed on February 11, 1972 by the ardent devotees of Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba. Under the able Presidentship of Shri D.C. Patel and Vice-Presidentship of Shri K.C. Bakiwala, the Samithi within a year has made phenomenal progress in many directions. Shri Shyam Singh is its Secretary and he was a human dynamo in so far as the activities of the Samiti are concerned. It was a pleasure to watch this personality in action, so dedicated and untiring that it becomes in factious. Shri Narpat Singh, Joint Secretary and other members of the Samithi had been on their toes to see that all the programmes were successfully conducted during the divine visit. The active members at that time were- Shri Adiviappa, Shri D.P. Nair, Shri Shyam Singh, Shri J.N. Sharma, Shri H.M. Agarwal, Shri S.P. Joshi, Shri B.K. Mathur, Shri Ragubir Singh and Shri B.L. Banerji. In the beginning bhajans were held at the house of Shri Narpat Singh and Adviappa. Later, the bhajan center was shifted to Divine Hall in Bani Park and then Sri Sathya Sai College for Women, Jaipur. Most of the above named devotees had attended the Rajmundry Conference. Amongst these, Shri Adviappa and Shri J.N. Sharma worked as State President.

The Samithi has organized a Seva Dal of both gentlemen and lady members. There was a Mahila Vibhag, Headed by Smt. Shyam Singh, which attends to Bal Vikas and Seva Dal activities, besides having Bhajans were held in different localities on Thursdays. Nagar Sankirtan programme of bhajans and arati on the lines of Nagar Sankirtan were being carried out in the mornings once in a month. Celebrations were also carried out with great enthusiasm on Guru Poornima, Janmashtami, Dassera, Bhagavan's Birthday and Mahashivaratri. The Samithi also got opportunity to organize various State Level Conferences. Also, So far three All India Presidents have paid visit at Jaipur Samithi- Shri Indu Lal Shah, Shri V. Srinivas, and Present AIP Shri Nimish Pandya.

When the activities of Sri Sathya Sai Seva Samithi Jaipur is reviewed for the past 40 years several important names come to mind –Late Shri S.L. Laddha, Shri B.G. Pitre, Late Shri S.R. Mishra, Smt. Pushplata Mishra, Shri Bhatiya, Dr. S.N. Srivastava, , Shri V.S. Murthy, Shri Kulshreshta, Late Col. N.k. Sharma, Smt. Pota, Shri Shaitan Singh, Shri R.C. Katara, Shri & Smt. Kamlesh Mathur, Smt. Kokila Sood, Smt. Asha Audichya, Sri G.D. Gupta, Smt. Sushila Gupta, Sri Randhir Singh, Smt. Vinita Singh, Late Shri Mohan Mali, Smt. Yashoda Mali, Late Sri Ashok Sharma, Smt. Chandra Kala Sharma, Sri M.L. Ojha, Shri S.C. Gupta and Smt. Sita Gupta, Late Sri Anil Paul, Smt. Anju Paul etc. There are many more names who have contributed for the Jaipur Samithi.

Presently, the Samithi Bhajans are being conducted on every Thursday at Raghu Vihar, Mansarovar, Shipra path, Jaipur from evening 6:30 to 8:00 PM. The Samithi organizes various programs regularly like- Sadhna Camp, Bhajan Training Programme, Medical Camp, Blood Donation Camp, Narayan Seva, Vocational Training, Ved Path Training, Laksharchana Program, Bal Vikas Training, Gram Seva, Seven House Hold Bhajans, Parthi Yatra, Prashanti Seva, Nagar Sankirtan, Disaster Management Program, Swachta Se Divyata Tak, Study Circle etc.

The Sathya Sai College for Women, Jaipur

Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba lays great emphasis on Education for life, not only for living, with this aim in view, baba has started many, educational institutions all over India. Sri Sathya Sai Education integrates theories of Naturalism, idealism, and pragmatism bridging the gap between spirituality and Science, spirit and the mind, truth and knowledge, individual and society. In 1969, Bhagwan Baba himself summed up the operational design of HIS EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS. He said:

“It is indeed deplorable that the education of Spirit has been totally neglected, while attention is devoted to the training of skills and for gleaning and garnering information. This college and other such colleges which I am establishing in every state of India has one of its purposes- the demonstration to the people of the urgency of this task as well as the way in which it can be fulfilled. My sankalpa is to provide the youth with an education which, while cultivating their intelligence, will also purify their impulses and emotions and equips them with physical and mental disciplines needed for drawing upon the springs of calmness and Joy that lie in their own hearts. Their higher natures will have to be fostered and encouraged to blossom by means of spiritual studies, prayers, sandhana and contacts with sages, saints and spiritual heroes & heroines of their land. This will place them on the path of Self- confidence, Self-Satisfaction, Self-sacrifice and Self-knowledge.”

With this purpose and specific mission the foundation stone for SRI SATHYA SAI COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, JAIPUR was formally laid at the lotus hands of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba in March 26, 1973. This was the first positive step taken towards the realization of the cherished ambition of the late Shri Poonamchand Kamani to set up an ideal college in Jaipur. The Kamani family has donated a piece of land covering an area of about 12 acres for setting up this institution. A trust was formed to construct and run this institution. The college was intended to provide University education in arts, science and commerce with a stress on spiritual education. Besides the usual courses, this college trains the students through spiritual preachings and discourses and prepare them to face the materialistic world with courage and equanimity.

Rajasthan as is well known lags far behind in women's education. A lot of effort has to be put into the setting up of this girl's college. To convince parents into sending their daughter for higher education was itself a herculean task. The completion of it was a milestone in the college's quest due to the untiring efforts of the Founder- Principal Miss Anima Mukarjee and her dedicated staff. It was their hard work which bore fruit and the college which had begun with meagre strength of 74 students and the single faculty of ARTS has progressed from strength to strength. At present the enrolment is over 500 students and the faculties of Arts, Commerce and Science have since been added.

DIVINE VISIT

The soil of Rajasthan received unlimited grace by the visits of Bhagwan Baba, three times during 1973, 1975 and 1982. The visits to Jaipur were Joyous occasions full of his loving compassion and inspiration.

Swami Visited Sri Sathya Sai College at Jaipur on 5th April 1975 and address the students of the college.

“The young girls who study in this college today will become mothers tomorrow. It is therefore necessary that they should equip themselves with all the culture, learning and wisdom that they need in their future lives. In India, we studying here should train themselves in such a way that they can live up to the ideals and aspirations of an Indian woman.

We consider women as Grihalakshmi, Dharmapatni, and so on. A woman has to maintain her house. She is not only the house wife, but on her depends the glory or otherwise of the whole country. That is why we say this is our motherland. It is in this spirit that we refer to our country as Bharat Mata. We also find that women are given the first position when they are associated with their counterparts as Seeta-Rama, Lakshmi Narayana, Radha Krishna and Parvati-Parameshwara. It is only to establish this Prominence given to women in our country and to train our young girls on these lines that we took up the task of opening such colleges.

I expect the young girls studying in this college to cultivate such good qualities which will bring name and fame to the native homes and also to those where they proceed after marriage. The bad habits and vulgar behavior that we find in most of the young girls today should not find a place in the girls of this College. The girls of a Sathya Sai College should maintain the ideals of the institutions and keep the prestige of their homes, their society and their culture. It is only then that the purpose of establishing this college can be served.”

There is no greater disease than slavery to sensuous desires, there is no bigger enemy than attachment with the sense objects, even fire is not so fiery compared to the onslaught of anger; there is no greater happiness than the attainment of wisdom.

There is no higher devotion than the perpetual remembrance of the Lord, recitation of his name, meditation upon his form, and service to mankind.

✓ Embodiments of Divinity :

The land of Bharat has been adorned mostly by the people who have adhered to right conduct. Our body is like a factory. It is enjoined upon all the limbs of the body to perform their allotted task. You all know that in this factory, there are various types of machines. You also know that in a human body there are several components. This body is a complicated machine, but its every component functions because of fundamental and universal truth which is its permanent base. It is true that all of you have different names and forms but, the indwelling Atma is inherent in each one of you. A machine appears very beautiful and valuable but it is quite futile if it is not utilised efficiently. In

that case it only remains a mere form. If in a machine, the electric current is absent then it is merely a piece of metal. So also, if in a human body, sivism is absent, then it is merely a savam — a corpse. Be convinced that Siva is in every one of you. Instil that vision in your inner consciousness.

We should always remain alert and ready to perform our duties properly. Performance of work is the manifestation of the inner urge. You should develop an interest in your work, and thereby have the satisfaction of doing your duty efficiently and successfully. In spiritual field three points should be remembered. These are, work, worship and wisdom. These three are deeply inter-connect-

ed with each other. They cannot be isolated from each other. Worship involves action, and without devotion, wisdom cannot be achieved. Everyone can progress by doing his duty whole-heartedly. The physical body is meant for action and for service. Mind has to be used for worship. The pursuit of wisdom helps to apprehend the Real. These three factors are not distinct, but they supplement and converge. For example, if a tree does not have the seeds in it then it will not bear raw fruit; and if the raw fruit is not formed, then how can you have the ripe fruit. All this springs from the hidden seed. You know that the seed becomes the raw fruit, then it becomes the ripe fruit. Likewise, work, worship and wisdom are within you and not anywhere else. Our life can only be happy if our body is healthy. Only then life can be a success. The different organs in a body are pervaded by one current, that is, the Atma. Likewise, the workers in a factory are its different organs and the employer is its Atma. Just as we love our Atma, so also we should love and respect our employer. The coordinated work and unified effort are necessary for the successful functioning of a factory. Therefore, it is very essential for you all to develop a unified spirit amongst yourselves and with the employer so as to enable you to live as one happy family. Even if all of you do not get sufficient time to perform the ritualistic worship or sit in meditation, you are advised to perform your work and duty efficiently and that can be considered as genuine pursuit of God.

Duty is God, work is worship. Happiness can only be gained by performing one's duty. On the other hand if you keep on increasing your needs disproportionate to your earnings, then you will come to grief. Just as it is important for the body to have breath, so also it is equally important to have faith in Atma. We should endeavour to lead a life of self-confidence. When you have self-confidence, you will have self-satisfaction. When you have self-satisfaction, you will develop the spirit of self-sacrifice. Through sacrifice, you can attain the supreme state of Blissful Awareness. The final goal of bliss can only be achieved through sacrifice and not through wealth, society or activity. Sacrifice gives us peace, sensuous desires and their pursuit give us disease. We will always profit by developing a desire for sacrifice. For example, when we take food,

we have to get rid of the residue. If you do not do it, you will be ill. Likewise, when we inhale, we have to exhale as well. If we do not exhale, our lungs will get affected. If there is less circulation of blood in some part of our body, then in that part a boil appears. Therefore, whenever we sacrifice, we automatically get an experience of bliss. If you work in a detached way, you will naturally get the reward of your action. Service is the primary duty of all human beings, that is how you ascend from humanity to divinity. Ego and selfishness are destroyed by the spirit of service.

All knowing Lord Krishna played the role of an ordinary charioteer to Arjuna. He not only held the reins of the horses but also looked after the well-being of the horses. We should go on performing our duties like this. We should not consider one work to be of a higher nature and another of a lower nature. The allotted task should be performed. We should be concerned about our duty and remain unconcerned with the bigness or smallness of the work. The span of our life may come to an end at any time. We should consider this allotted life as a chance to remain pure in action, thought, and behaviour. This is a great saadhana to subdue one's anger. Anger is the root cause of all sins. On its account many men start decaying even during their youth. If you remain angry, then the body becomes weak, appetite is lost and you become old. Therefore, we should try and quieten ourselves by initially keeping quiet. It is true that you cannot always oblige but you can always speak obligingly. Speak softly, sweetly. Take a small example. The function of the eye is to see, ears are for hearing, nose is for smelling, and skin for feeling. All these different organs can only perform one work. Tongue has twin purposes to perform. To taste and to speak. Therefore, tongue is the most important part. One must endeavour to keep it under control. There are two eyes and you can see two visions. There are two ears, they can hear good and bad. But there being one tongue you should try to speak the truth. There is no Dharma or religion or right conduct in this world which is higher than truth. We should use our tongue only for speaking truth. Individual life can attain liberation only through truth. You can avoid seeing evil, speaking evil, hearing evil, doing evil or thinking evil. These five evils can be avoided.

Paramatma is nowhere else but dwelling in each one of you. If you do sadhana, you not only attain God but you merge in God. Accepting this eternal truth, lead a higher and a moral life to make your life a success. It is of extreme importance for man not to talk ill of others. One should not be an impediment in anybody's work. Foolishly, at times we talk ill of others but later on we suffer ourselves on that account. What we sow today, we reap tomorrow. Therefore, we should do good work. We should talk well and we should perform our duties. Be good, see good and do good. In order to lead this kind of life, we have to do some kind of sadhana. For example, look at this garland. It is constituted of two articles, one flowers, and second the string. Although the string is a base of these flowers, what is seen is only the flowers and not the string. But without that string, flowers will not have the shape of the garland. There are several flowers but only one string. It is the characteristic of flowers to blossom today and wither away tomorrow. But the indwelling and the unseen thread is eternal, it was the same yesterday, it is the same today and it will be the same tomorrow. This string is always everywhere. Atma is the base of the phenomenal world as well as it is all prevalent. Therefore, the thread is known as Brahmasutra. Realising the indwelling Atma in everyone and every where, we should all remain united. Atma is like an electric cur-

rent which is in every part of the machine. This is called the will power. Sadhana helps to strengthen this will power. Therefore, whenever we get an opportunity for this kind of satsang, we should happily participate in such meetings. Realising all this, it is imperative that we all should consider the entire humanity as one human family. Not only this, man should fear sin and love God. Like this we should go on enhancing love amongst ourselves, thereby enabling us to attain atma-shakti or will power.

This gathering has created a unique atmosphere of brotherliness. This opportunity has been carved out by yourselves. On this occasion, I give you all my blessing. You may go on loving, co-operating, co-ordinating amongst yourselves and with your employer ushering into a happy family, indulging in satsangs of this type resulting in physical and spiritual advancement.

Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba ended up the discourses giving a lead in chorus of the Bhajan "Govind Hare.....Gopal Hare....."

So sweet, so enthralling that people were literally submerged in that holy atmosphere. As Baba left, people were looking at each other, unable to believe, unwilling to break the spell. Silently they stood up, wended their way to collect the prasad.

The service of man is more valuable than what you call 'service to God'. God has no need of your service. Life is best spent in alleviating pain, assuaging distress and promoting peace and joy.

Bhagavan Lays Foundation Stone of Sai College in Jaipur

The Kamani Agricultural Farm at Sanganer, ten kilometres away from the Jaipur city had the pride of place among the crowded programmes of Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba. This was the main function for which Baba was coming all the way to Jaipur.

It was the cherished ambition of the late Shri Poonamchand Kamani to set up a college of Arts, Science and Commerce in Jaipur. He had visualised that the modern education needed spiritualisation so that the young students truly imbibed the values of ancient culture. He had wanted the children to be equipped to become integrated human beings embodying the moral values. He had wanted to name it Sathya Sai College of Arts, Science and Commerce.

What then can be more fitting than that the teacher of all teachers, Sri Sathya Sai Baba himself should lay the foundation stone of this College?

The site for the college was deep inside the compound, away from the main gate. A pandal was erected and a very fine artistically conceived dais came up. The back-

drop, in refreshing bottle-green shade immediately drew the attention of every one. Standing alone and situated so far away from the inhabited places, it was felt that this would be a formal function without too much of the crowd influence. People here had not reckoned with the magnetic pull of Baba. On 26th March 1973 at 4 P.M. every one stood confounded. There was a serpentine line of men, women and children spanning the gate and the pandal. That line, continuously moving had been there for more than ninety minutes. By 4 P.M. the pandal was filled to capacity. It was a great and cosmopolitan crowd which included Ministers, Government officials and foreign dignitaries.

It all looked so natural, so much like a village scene, as Sri Sathya Sai Baba entered the Kamani Agricultural Farm through beautifully decorated arch of welcome. There was nothing but greenery all over and around the place. The wheat crops swayed to the breeze as though to carry the holy air all along the farm. The leaves rustled

as though the huge trees were having a whispered discussion on this great event. The late-comers rushing to the pathway not to miss anything. The cavalcade strode and through the huge side entrance and along the carpeted floor, Baba entered the pandal.

The grand old lady, Smt. Jadavben, the mother of the Kamani Brothers, welcomed Bhagavan on his arrival. His face beaming with love and affection he moved from corner to corner, giving his darshans to all, blessing them all who had come a long way for this function.

Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba then initiated the Bhoomi poojan and sanctified the ground as pundits chanted hymns from the holy scriptures. The sight of Bhagavan himself, in his physical presence, and in this role, enthralled the entire audience. Shri Rasikbhai was ever at the side of Bhagavan, who then turned and gave the full grace of his blessings to Shri Rasikbhai for all that he had done to bring about the creation of this college. All that had gone into the making of this — the time, the efforts, the money — had now been fully rewarded by that one second of compliment. The crowning glory of it was that Baba applied with his own hand tilak on the forehead of Shri Rasikbhai.

"We are beholden to Bhagavan for his infinite grace. His very presence here brings sunshine to our hearts, a truly soul-filling and elevating experience for all of us.

We are most fortunate to have his presence and blessings at this ceremony of the laying of the Foundation Stone of the Sri Sathya Sai College of Arts, Science and Commerce. His presence and blessings would go a long way in the perpetuation of the ideals so sacred to him and so important to us, especially since this Institution aspires to dedicate itself for the moulding of destinies of the youth in whose hands the future of the country rests.

I would like to mention here that Bhagavan has already set up a number of educational institutions and chain of colleges in various States in the country. My beloved elder brother, Shri Poonamchand, who unfortunately is not with us today physically, had an

The College whose foundation stone is being laid today by Bhagavan, would provide University Education in Arts, Science and Commerce. Besides this, the students will be trained in discipline and the spiritual values so as to mould their character and make them into better citizens of tomorrow. The vast gathering of humanity present here is anxiously waiting to have Bhagavan's blessings. I would not like to stand between you and him. In all humility, I pray Bhagavan to give his Divine Blessings so that this Institution would start functioning at the earliest!"

Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba, who had preferred to stand all the time, now came closer to the mike. At the other end, none other than Dr. Bhagavantham himself stood up to give the English interpretation. Necks were craned to get much more closer to Baba

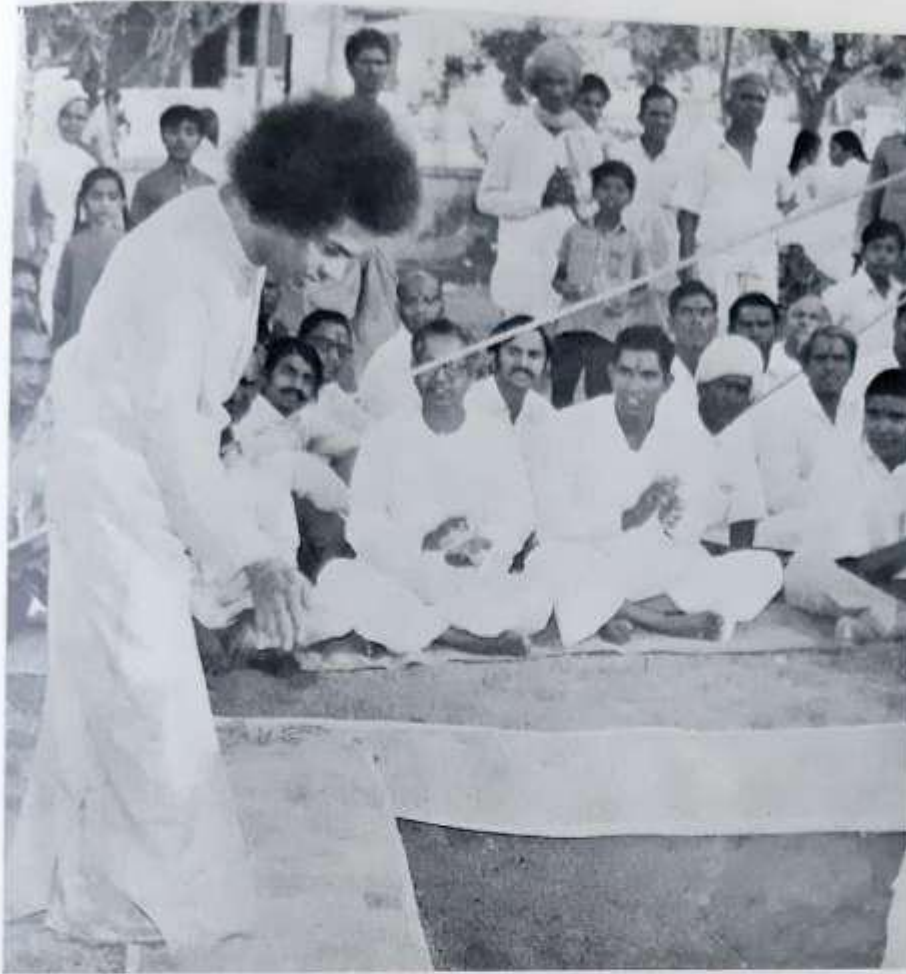
and to hear him. It looked as though the musical world had put out an extravaganza as the lilting, rhythmic and rich voice of Baba swept through the audience. 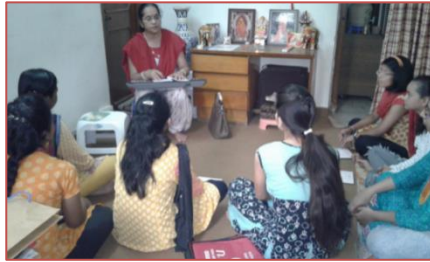

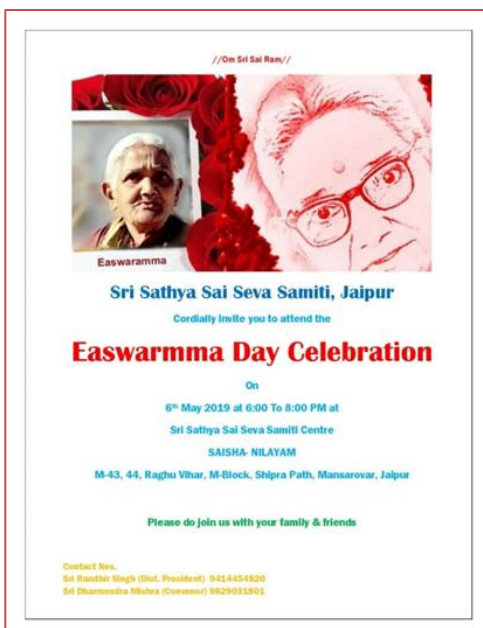

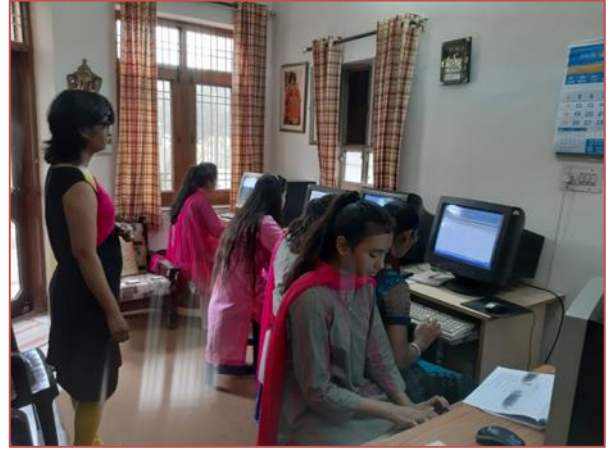

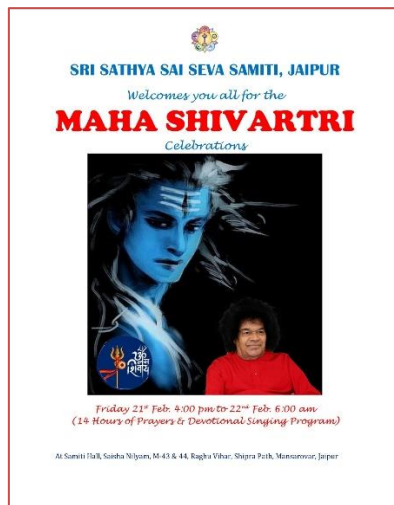

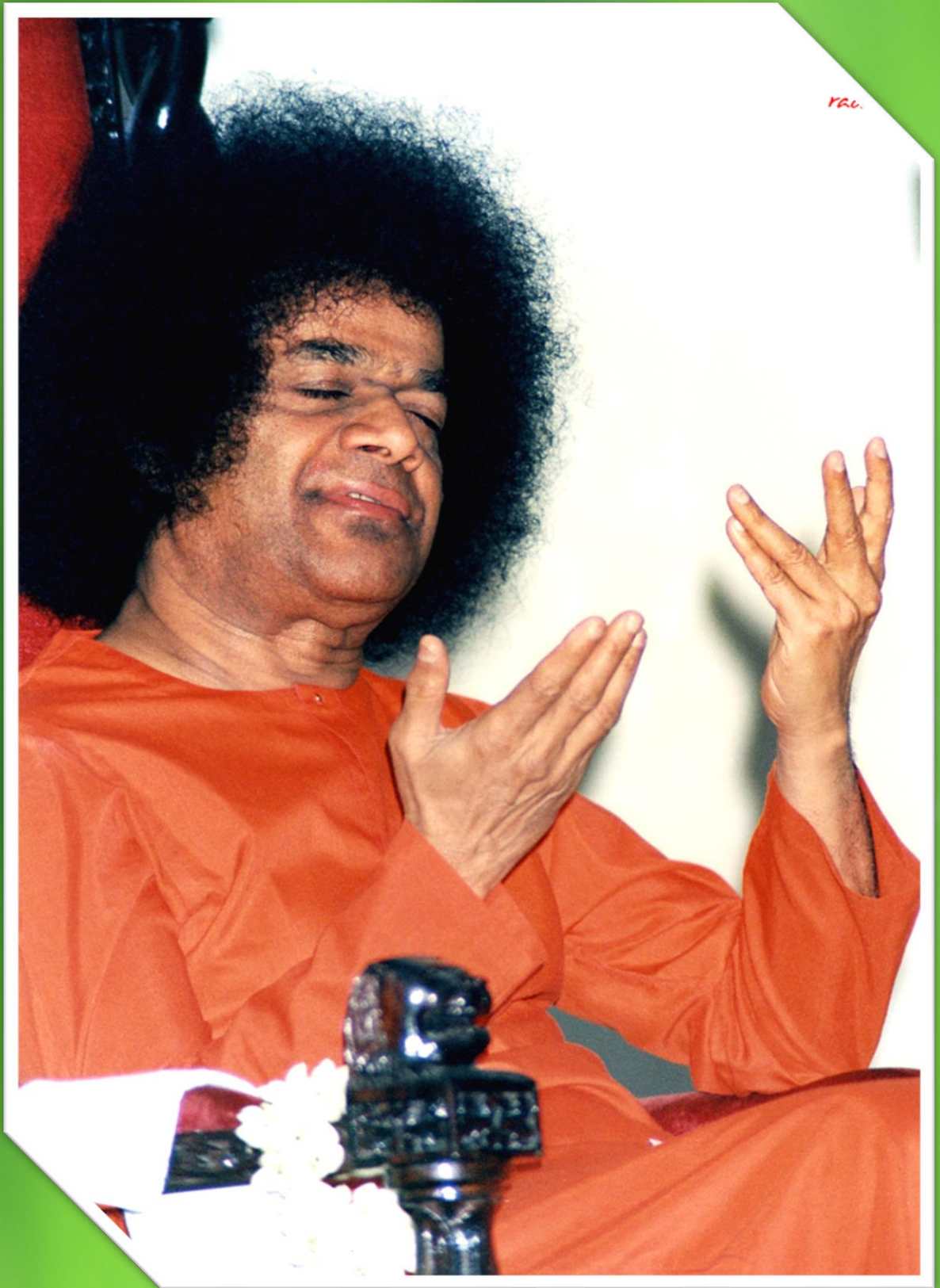
